Thank You teachers and students for your amazing and exciting gifts for the new school!



Our school, Austin Elementary, is really old. The We are about to move to a new school next to the Dunwoody Nature Center.


We are using Chrome Books to type this up. Do you have any new technology in your time? Please write back.


