<u>Safety Patrol</u>
Safety Patrols are responsible leaders of the school. Their duties include raising and lowering the flag, directing lost children and parents to their appropriate destinations, modeling hallway behavior, and leading morning announcements. Patrols must be able to communicate well with both adults and children. Evaluation is based on the following criteria:
Attendance: Is the student punctual and only absent for legitimate reasons?
 Leadership: In a group, does the student stand out as a positive force? Is the student a role model for others?
 Courtesy: Does the student treat all adults (faculty, staff, parents) and peers with courtesy and respect?
 Responsibility: Does the student take responsibility for his/her actions? Is the student dependable?
• Speaking Skills: Is the student able to speak persuasively? Clearly? With charisma?
