1. Call to Order

a. SPLOST-V - Austin School Council will support project list for SPLOST recommendations; expansions for middle and high school

b. Construction Committee- Ann met with Dan Drake; Austin Elementary is now owned by the city of Dunwoody; new construction committee is still working on having a training with the chair of the council and Dr. Culbreath to determine how the committee works. Recommendation is for a 5 person committee – 2 from our current council; Dr. C recommended Alan Mothner and 2 more community members.

Spirit Night – Chick-Fil-A – no numbers yet Wing Factory - \$280 from last spirit night Plan to pick up Mellow Mushroom next year Village Burger – most successful so far Class Pictures Feb 10 Spring Pictures and 5th Grade pictures – April 12 (no uniform) \$2700 raised so far; guaranteed to get \$4500 Yearbook orders close Feb 24th; still need to sell 30-40 yearbooks to break even Hospitality - Feb 9 Conference Night – Italian theme No lunch monitors needed during 4th and 5th grade

Feb 3rd – Nomination committee for next year PTO council

Need 2 parent liaisons to serve as go-between for DES for Golf Tournament for their fund-raising campaign for DHS football stadium; liaison role will be mainly the voice of communication for Austin; solicit donations for live auction, etc.

Golf tournament will be held in the fall, October, 2017. (Austin needs 2 foursomes) Box tops – Feb 3rd School Supplies – Amy Halligan starting to plan

International Families- Tea; planning Intl Stem night (May 4th, GA STEM Day May 5th) 2nd grade circus – March 23^{rd;} all is going well

Spirit Wear – simplified options, new STEM shirt designed by 4th introduced at K registration Field Day – We will have a rain date; DJ and Inflatables company offered rain date alternative at no cost

Walk to School Wednesday – 4 next year; 2 are Family Socials; 2 are Spirit Days instead of monthly. Sept, Oct, March, May – due to safety concerns

Teacher Appreciation week – 1st week of May (aligned with National Teacher Appreciation Week)

d. Austin CIP – Heidi Hilkert

Continuous Improvement Plan – sets goals for school achievement; it is a living document that guides achievement goals.

Hilkert presented a summary of the SMART goals.

 e. Gifted Eligibility letter- Council plans to meet with Dunwoody Cluster Chairpersons to gather support for letter from Cluster to DeKalb County regarding gifted eligibility recommendations and MAP testing. Council islooking out for the best interests of our students, especially Kindergarten students. MOTION: H Knight, Approved: Unanimous

f. GOSA Awards- 97.1 CCRPI – Platinum Award; anything above 93% earns an award. Platinum Status- how state discerns between scores above 93%. GADOE looks at greatest gains, and meets or exceeds in testing. Double Platinum – Austin Elementary.

Received 2 certificates and a letter from Governor Deal; Dr. Culbreath looked at data from the whole state of Georgia; Austin is the only school in DeKalb County to achieve double Platinum. There were only a handful of schools statewide to get double platinum status.

Georgia Parent Survey impacts our School Climate score – we received 4 STARs for School Climate this year, 3 last year (improvement) – 95%; survey window for parents is open until March.
